FHU benefit dinner with Kurt Warner makes record

Freed-Hardeman University's 58th Annual Benefit Dinner with NFL Quarterback Kurt Warner, winner of Super Bowl XXXIV, raised nearly \$1.7 million for student scholarships Friday, Dec. 2, 2022. The event's success bumped fellow NFL quarterback Peyton Manning's 2016 appearance at the event to third place, a highlight for Warner, who still enjoys competing off the field with other football greats. FHU's 2010 Benefit Dinner with former President George W. Bush still holds the record for the most funds raised during the event.

Following remarks by FHU Board Chair Ted Williams, the opening act for the evening in Loyd Auditorium was the legendary Red Steagall and the Bunkhouse Boys. Then FHU President David R. Shannon and Warner took the stage for an interview style conversation.

Warner discussed life with his wife, Brenda, and their seven children and how he seeks to be present for and support them. He answered questions about his football journey that is portrayed in the movie "American Underdog" and talked about the importance of the non-profit he and Brenda have founded, Treasure House

Medical building demolition is underway

Demolition began Monday, Dec. 5, on the Medical Building at the corner of Hart St. and North Ave. near downtown Henderson.

According to Chester County Property Assessor Beverly Morton, property records show the property was purchased March 6, 1959 by Dr. O.M. McCallum and Dr. R.L. Wilson, from James L. and Ethel May Holland McHaney. The lot at that time reportedly included a two-story home, accord-

ing to Chester County resident Neil Smith.

While the exact amount is unknown due to the combination of an existing lien, interest and city/county taxes, Drs. McCallum and Wilson paid somewhere between \$8,000 and \$12,000 for the property. The medical building itself was constructed in 1962. It is unknown when the house also on the property was torn down.

January 5, 1998, the property was sold, from Drs. McCallum and Wilson, to Jackson Clinic P.A. for

\$225,000. It was surveyed at 1.10 acres at that time. The medical building changed hands again March 31, 2006, from Jackson Clinic P.A. to Madison Clinic Cooperation, for the cost of \$390,000. It became vacant sometime between 2006 and 2018, when Madison Clinic conveyed the property to West Tennessee Healthcare - Jackson Madison County General Hospital District for an unknown amount due to the government entity tax exempt status of JMCCH.

Finally, the medical building became the property of

Chester County on Aug. 18, 2020. With no cash exchange, the property transfer was included in negotiations with WTH for construction of the Ambulance facility on South Church Ave. in Henderson, according to Chester County Mayor Barry Hutcherson.

The Chester County Commission recently voted to raze the site, due to the deteriorated condition of the building. The property will be home to a new Chester County Election Commission facility.

City board meets tonight

The City of Henderson Mayor and Board of Aldermen are scheduled to meet at 7 p.m. tonight, Thursday, December 8, in the council chamber of the Henderson City Hall.

The board will appoint or reappoint one member each to the Planning Commission, the Board of Zoning Appeals, the Industrial Development Board and the City Park Advisory Board. Mayor King is recommending the reappointment of Ron Moten to the PC, Charles McNatt to the BZA, Milton Sewell to the IDB and James Arnold to the Park Board. Mayor King is also recommending that Marty Watson be appointed to the PC to fill the vacancy left by the passing of Bobby Ruth.

Other items on the agenda include consideration of passage of an ordinance amending personnel policy to reflect the change made to the Fire Chief position converting it to a 40-hour-per-week schedule, consideration of adoption of resolution authorizing the city to execute an amendment to the 2017 Gas Supply Agreement with TEAC and consideration of the purchase of gas meters and gas regulators for inventory.

Also to be discussed is COVID leave for city employees and any other business.

(treasurehouse.org). Inspired by their oldest son Zack, they envisioned and created this community for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities to be supported in developing meaningful relationships and contributing their gifts to society.

"Life is bigger than football," Warner told the audience. "God had a plan. His divine hand was on everything, and I count myself as blessed. Sometimes life is a struggle, but we have to decide to be great everyday." Warner also encouraged the audience to be a positive influence in the lives of others. "Don't miss your moment to impact someone's life," he said. "It's going to bear fruit down the road, whether we hear about it or not."

FHU senior and Student
Government Association

President Kayley Wadlington also interviewed Warner, who shared that he credits his rags to riches journey to the NFL to his

faith and related it to the story of David and Goliath. "God prepares you to face challenges, and you have to take the opportunity to be successful," Warner said. Wadlington couldn't resist asking Warner to revisit a time that she and her friends remember — when he was a guest star on the Disney series "The Suite Life on Deck." "My kids at the time thought it was the coolest thing," Warner said with a laugh. Wadlington asked Warner to provide some advice for soon-to-be graduates and those students just starting out. As he encouraged students to make their faith their own, he said, "We're here for Him."

The 58th Annual Benefit Dinner on FHU's campus also featured the Merry Market hosted by the FHU Associates — a festive shopping experience. It was part of Christmas in the Commons, which brings carolers and a horse-drawn carriage to greet guests each year.

Hagerty, Kaine, Rubio, Cardin introduce bipartisan legislation to support human rights in Venezuela

United States Senator Bill Hagerty (R-TN), a member of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, along with Senators Tim Kaine (D-VA), Marco Rubio (R-FL), and Ben Cardin (D-MD), introduced the Assuring that the Fact-Finding Examination Continues to Track (AFFECT) Human Rights in Venezuela Act, legislation to help support human rights in Venezuela.

This legislation would direct the U.S. government to support extending the mandate of the UN Fact Finding Mission (FFM) in Venezuela — an investigation into ongoing human rights abuses being perpetrated — until the crisis in the country is resolved.

It also requires further action by the U.S. government to support human rights in Venezuela. This introduction comes as the Maduro regime and the Venezuelan opposition have resumed talks and agreed to a humanitarian fund to be implemented by the United

Nations.

“Maduro’s narco-terrorist regime aligns itself with China, Russia, and Iran, and poses a significant threat to security, prosperity and human dignity in the Western Hemisphere,” said Senator Hagerty.

“The United States must use its voice, vote, and influence to extend the international Fact Finding Mission in Venezuela and ensure that the Maduro regime is held fully accountable for its egregious abuses against the Venezuelan people.”

“The resumption of talks between the Maduro regime and Venezuelan opposition, including agreement on a critical humanitarian fund to be administered by the UN, is a promising and welcome development. But it’s important to remember that Maduro and his regime continue to commit grave crimes and human rights violations against their own people. They have allowed the forced recruitment and exploitation of children as soldiers by

gangs, caused over seven million Venezuelans to flee their homes, fanned the flames of food insecurity, and pushed Venezuela to become one of the world’s largest refugee crises,” said Senator Kaine.

“Extending and bolstering support for the UN Fact Finding Mission in Venezuela is an urgent and necessary step to help support human rights in the country. By protecting human rights in Venezuela and holding Maduro accountable, we can also begin to address the root causes of migration from Venezuela to the U.S.”

“While the Maduro narco-regime actively seeks international legitimacy from far left governments in our region, the free world must remember the criminal nature of this despotic dictatorship,” said Senator Rubio. “The people of Venezuela have been subjected to unimaginable hardships, as documented by the UN Fact Finding Mission. We have a moral duty to fight for justice

and ensure Maduro and his thugs are held accountable.”

“For years, the Maduro regime has repressed political opposition and engaged in gross human rights violations. The United Nations has identified over 3,000 abuses amounting to crimes against humanity committed by Maduro and other high-ranking officials since 2014, including instances of gender-based violence, torture, and extra-judicial killings. The UN Fact Finding Mission is a critical tool in identifying human rights violators and ensuring they face justice,” said Senator Cardin. “The United States must support the extension of the Mission’s mandate until Venezuela’s electoral and humanitarian crises are fully resolved.”

The FFM in Venezuela was established in 2019 to investigate extrajudicial killings, disappearances, arbitrary detentions and torture, and other cruel, inhumane, or degrading treatment since 2014.

The FFM has published several extensive reports documenting evidence of human rights violations, including crimes against humanity, in Venezuela.

The AFFECT Human Rights in Venezuela Act would help ensure that the FFM is able to continue its crucial work. Specifically, the legislation would:

Require the Secretary of State to use the voice, vote, and influence of the U.S. at the UN to extend the FFM mandate until a democratic resolution to the Venezuelan crisis is achieved and to offer assistance as necessary to ensure the FFM can complete its work;

Urge the FFM to raise early warnings of further deterioration of the democracy and human rights situation in Venezuela ahead of the country’s expected 2024 and 2025 elections;

Require the President to instruct the U.S. UN Ambassador to:

Work with relevant UN authorities to secure the

release of wrongfully detained foreign nationals, including Americans;

Advocate for a UN General Assembly resolution condemning the Venezuelan regime’s use of political prisoners as leverage; and

Urge the UN and related agencies to address the humanitarian needs of the Venezuelan people, including refugees and migrants in third countries.

Require the President and Secretary of State to review and give due consideration to the FFM’s reports when forming U.S. policy toward Venezuela; and

Require the Secretary of State to report on these actions to the appropriate House and Senate committees within 90 days of enactment.

Companion legislation has been introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives by U.S. Representatives Albio Sires (NJ-08) and Joaquin Castro (TX-20) and 10 of their House colleagues.

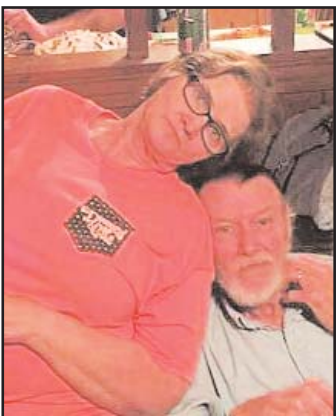

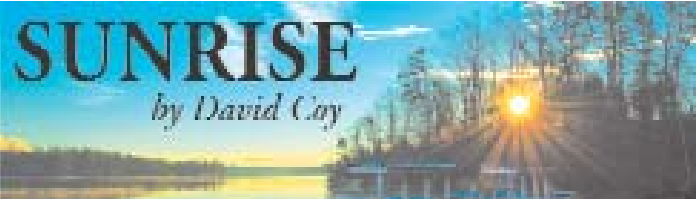

Hope

As we discussed last week, some people struggle with this time of year - perhaps more people than is realized. Yet, this season, just as every day, has great potential for hope. This season especially promotes hope, packaging it as the season of cheer. As an added bonus, this season promotes good will to be shared by all to everyone they interact with. The word hope comes from the greek word elpis (pronounced, elpece') which means to anticipate, expectation or confidence. Thus too confidently expect with (usually with pleasure) anticipation. This may be perceived as a daunting task for those in their beginning walk and acute journey with grief. If this is the case for someone we know, then we should do our very best to be a positive cheer; emulate good will before them while we strive to show them there is reason to hope even during this season. A great illustration of this is a time in the life of the Apostle Paul and Silas outside the city of Philippi. The locals charged them with agitating the city and proclaiming customs that were not lawful for the people to do. Paul and Silas were beaten with rods with many blows resulting in wounds, and then Paul and Silas were jailed in the inner



prison (pestilential cells, damp and cold, from which the light was excluded, and where the chains rusted on the prisoners), and their feet fastened in the stocks (a fetter or shackle for the feet).

Thus, they certainly might have believed they would be justified in being negative and pessimistic, yet they were not. They rather were discovered possessing the confidence, joyful anticipation in their future. When we have reason to sorrow, it is easy to dwell solely upon our negative circumstances even though there exists hope for the future. May we encourage one another if we

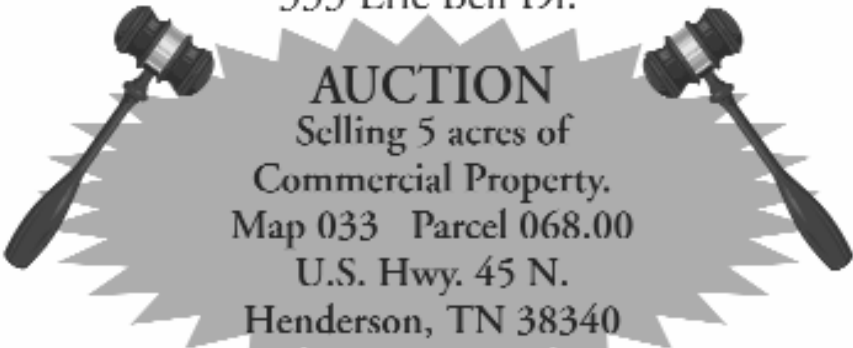

1102. Potential objectors should contact Community and Rural Development to
verify the actual last day of the objection period.

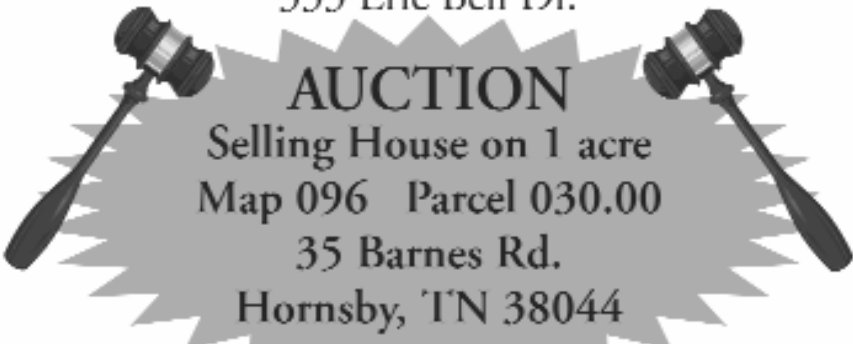
